Multicultural Community Weekend

MCW is for those interested in being more involved in the multicultural community of College Ten. The goal of this weekend retreat is to learn more about the community and ourselves while developing leadership skills. Through a series of structured exercises and discussions, we will explore areas impacting our individual identities (e.g. race, class, sexual orientation, gender), the College Ten community and our society as a whole.

Terry Freitas Cafe

Terry Freitas Café was created by students who wanted a chill spot in which they could hang out and build community. Open daily and every night, students can come here to hang out with friends, study for classes, play pool or board games or attend various special programs such as open mics, pool tournaments, or karaoke nights.

Community Garden Class & Club

Colleges Nine and Ten are creating a college garden! The Garden Club meets weekly to coordinate garden workdays and garden design, strategize outreach, and build community among Colleges 9 & 10 students. Students can also enroll in the 2-credit class in Spring, which is a hands-on introduction to ecological horticulture.

Praxis - Student Volunteer Community

Praxis is an organization geared toward community building and social justice. By participating in Praxis, students gain exposure to a variety of Santa Cruz community agencies and explore what it means to be social agents of social change.

Esprit de Corps - CLTE 110 & 110B

Esprit de Corps is a service-learning course for students who are interested in volunteering for credit in the Santa Cruz Community. Volunteers spend time each week in their placements (non-profits and local elementary schools) and meet weekly.

Teaching Social Justice - CLTE 191

Upper Division College Ten students are invited to apply to teach CLTE 85. Student instructors go through training in November and in winter quarter and meet weekly with an instructor to explore materials, techniques and tools to facilitate their own weekly section of 15-20 students for CLTE 85.
